SPATIAL MAPPING VALIDATION WORKSHOP REPORT

1. Introduction

Nakuru City conducted a comprehensive Digital Data Validation Workshop aimed at verifying the accuracy and completeness of urban infrastructure data collected across the city. The exercise was undertaken in collaboration with **Digireg Consultants** and the Nakuru City Management.

The initiative forms part of the City's broader urban planning and service delivery improvement strategy, ensuring that planning decisions are based on verified, community-confirmed data.

2. Participants

The workshop brought together the city board technical staffs, Digireg Consultants and residents of Nakuru City. The list of participants is attached.

3. Objectives of the Validation Exercise

The workshop was designed to:

- Verify the accuracy of digital data collected on public infrastructure.
- Confirm the physical existence and status of facilities captured in the system.
- Identify omissions or inconsistencies in the dataset.
- Provide residents with an opportunity to raise additional service delivery concerns.
- Strengthen transparency and participatory urban governance.

4. Scope of Data Reviewed

The validation exercise covered citywide infrastructure and public services, including:

- Educational institutions (primary, secondary schools, ECDE centres)
- Public markets

- Road networks
- Health facilities
- Drainage systems
- Solid waste management points
- Public utilities and community infrastructure

Representatives from all **18 wards** of Nakuru City participated in reviewing and verifying the information.

5. Workshop Proceedings

The validation workshop brought together:

- Ward representatives from all 18 wards
- City Management officials
- Technical team from DigiReg Consultants
- Community representatives

During the session:

- Participants reviewed digital records and maps of facilities within their respective wards.
- Residents cross-checked listed infrastructure against actual ground conditions.
- Corrections, additions, and clarifications were documented.
- Emerging issues not initially captured in the dataset were recorded for consideration.

The process was participatory, transparent, and highly interactive.

6. Key Issues Raised During Validation

While verifying existing records, participants highlighted several pressing concerns affecting their neighborhoods, including:

- Poor state of drainage systems
- Broken or deteriorating roads
- Insecurity in specific zones
- Waste management challenges
- Infrastructure gaps in fast-growing settlements

These inputs enriched the dataset and ensured that community realities were adequately reflected.

City Management

City Manager Gitau Thabanja emphasized that accurate data is foundational to effective planning and service delivery. He noted that the validation process ensures development priorities are aligned with real community needs and actual infrastructure status.

Consultancy Team

A representative from DigiReg Consultants commended the active participation of residents, observing that community involvement significantly strengthened the credibility, inclusivity, and reliability of the dataset.

Residents

Participants expressed satisfaction with the inclusive approach adopted by the City. They appreciated being directly involved in verifying information and shaping future development priorities.

The exercise was further acknowledged as part of the participatory governance approach under the administration of H.E. Susan Kihika, which residents commended for encouraging citizen engagement in planning processes.

8. Outcomes of the Validation Exercise

The validation workshop achieved the following outcomes:

- Improved accuracy and completeness of citywide infrastructure data.
- Identification of previously unrecorded facilities and service gaps.
- Strengthened community trust in the planning process.
- Documentation of priority concerns across wards.
- Enhanced data credibility for budgeting and project prioritization.

9. Next Steps

Upon completion of the validation process:

- The refined dataset will be consolidated and cleaned.
- Identified corrections will be integrated into the City's planning database.
- The verified data will inform project prioritization.
- Budget allocations will be aligned with validated infrastructure needs.


The City Management will utilize this evidence-based dataset to guide medium- and long-term development planning.


The exercise ensures that future development interventions are responsive, realistic, and reflective of the actual needs of residents across all 18 wards.
