REPORT ON PUBLIC PARTICIPATION EXERCISE ON IDENTIFICATION OF NAIVASHA MUNICIPALITY PROJECTS IN LAKEVIEW WARD FY 2025/2026

1. Background Information

Public participation is a key principle of governance as provided for under Article 10(2) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, which identifies public participation as one of the national values and principles of governance. This provision affirms the right of citizens to participate in decision-making processes and to have their views considered on matters affecting them.

Further, the public finance framework under Articles 201, 221 and 232 of the Constitution requires that public participation be integrated into financial planning and management processes. These constitutional provisions are further operationalized through the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and the Standing Orders of the National Assembly, which provide mechanisms for citizens to submit their views on budgetary matters.

At the county level, Section 113 of the County Governments Act, 2012 makes it mandatory for county governments to facilitate public participation in county planning and budgeting processes.

In line with these legal provisions, the County Government of Nakuru conducted public participation forums across all wards to collect views from residents during the preparation of the Financial Year 2025/2026 Budget Estimates and the Medium-Term Expenditure Framework.

The Lakeview Ward public participation forum for the FY 2025/2026 budget was held on 2nd April 2025 at the Naivasha Sub County Chambers, starting at 11:00 AM.

2. Public Notification and Mobilization

To ensure adequate public awareness and participation, residents of Lakeview Ward were mobilized through several communication channels. These included:

- Posters placed in strategic public locations within the ward
- Announcements during Sunday church services
- Social media platforms including WhatsApp groups
- Announcements during public barazas and community meetings



- Print media such as newspapers

These efforts were aimed at ensuring broad participation from community members across all areas within the ward.

3. Overview of the Public Participation Exercise

The public participation meeting commenced with an opening prayer led by Pastor Tobias.

Following the prayer, the Ward Administrator invited the government officers present to make brief introductory remarks. Participants were then given an opportunity to introduce themselves by stating their names and areas of residence.

The Ward Administrator welcomed all participants and appreciated them for turning up to contribute to the budgeting process. She emphasized that participation in the identification and prioritization of development projects is a constitutional right and responsibility of citizens, and encouraged members to actively share their views and development priorities for the ward.

Participants were then grouped according to their areas of residence to facilitate discussion and prioritization of development projects. Each group was required to appoint:

- One member to record the group's proposals, and
- One member to present the prioritized projects to the plenary session.

Community members who had prepared written memoranda were given the first opportunity to present their proposals to the meeting.

Most of the participants were drawn from Kihoto Estate, although all areas within Lakeview Ward were represented during the meeting.

4. Participation Demographics

A total of 67 residents attended the public participation forum.

The participation breakdown was as follows:

The representation reflected participation from different segments of the community, including youth, community leaders, residents, and professionals living within the ward.

5. Key Issues Raised by Participants

During the discussions, participants raised several issues related to development planning and service delivery within Lakeview Ward.

5.1 Delayed Implementation of Development Projects

Participants expressed concern regarding the delayed implementation of projects for the current financial year, noting that the financial year was nearing completion yet several projects had not commenced.

In response, the Ward Administrator and officers present explained that the delay was largely due to challenges experienced at the National Government level in passing the Finance Bill, which affected the national budget release and consequently delayed the disbursement of funds to county governments.

Participants were assured that once the funds are released and the necessary processes completed, the implementation of the projects will commence.

6. Linkage with Naivasha Municipality

Participants were also informed that beginning in the Financial Year 2025/2026, development projects identified through the ward public participation process within areas falling under Naivasha Municipality will be implemented through the Municipal administration.

This framework aims to enhance coordination in urban service delivery and ensure that projects identified by residents are aligned with the Naivasha Municipal Investment Plan and urban development priorities.

Through this arrangement, the Municipality will play a key role in supporting implementation of projects related

- Solid waste management
- Urban drainage and sanitation
- Market and trade infrastructure
- Urban roads and non-motorized transport infrastructure
- Street lighting and public safety infrastructure
- Environmental management and public spaces

The integration of ward projects into the municipal framework will enhance technical supervision, efficiency, and accountability in project implementation.

Conclusion.



Alex Mbugua**, followed by a word of prayer by **Ann Munene**, officially ending the meeting at **2:30 PM**.

This exercise reaffirmed the commitment of the County Government of Nakuru and **Naivasha Municipality** to inclusive governance, transparency, and citizen engagement in the planning and implementation of development projects.
